ITINERARY

DAY 1 Thursday, July 17 Arrive Nairobi, Kenya

Your flight will land at Jomo Kenyatta Airport. **Welcome to Africa!** Look forward to a journey through majestic, unspoiled landscapes to fabulous game reserves where the dark continent's incomparable wildlife is protected in its natural habitat. After disembarking from the aircraft, you will be met by a Customer Service Manager who will lead you to clear customs and immigration formalities and proceed to the arrivals lounge. You will be assisted to your transfer vehicle. Transfer by road to your hotel.

DAY 2 Friday, July 18 Nairobi City Tour, Giraffe Center, Elephant Orphanage

After breakfast, your guide will pick you up for a panoramic City Tour of Nairobi. Visit the Giraffe Centre. Then visit to the Daphne Sheldrick's Elephant Orphanage. Drive back to your hotel. **Daphne Sheldrick - Elephant Orphanage** is part of the David Sheldrick Conservation Foundation) that rehabilitates orphaned baby elephants and other wildlife here at her home just outside of Nairobi National Park. These babies have lost their mothers to poaching, death, injuries, on getting lost in the wild or other tragedies. Daphne and her dedicated staff raise them to be released back into the wild when they are ready. **The Giraffe Centre** provides an opportunity to come face to face with Africa's tallest mammal – Rothschild Giraffes. Set in 15 acres of indigenous forest and funded by East African Fund for Endangered Wildlife, children as well as adults are enchanted by the chance to observe and feed giraffes. One can also see the warthogs running around the Center.

The Sarova Stanley Hotel is a five-star hotel in Nairobi's central business district. It is the oldest hotel in the city, established in 1902, and has been known as the traditional meeting place for those going on safari. It has played host to royalty, politicians, movie stars and authors. The hotel offers indoor and outdoor restaurants serving global cuisine, an elegant bar and lounge, a rooftop swimming pool and health club, courtyard, fitness center and Spa. Each room includes air conditioning, minibar, room safe, hairdryer, satellite TV, double glazed windows, mosquito nets on request.

DAY 3 Saturday, July 19 Drive to Amboseli National Park, Kenya 206km, Drive 3-4 Hours

After breakfast, drive to **Amboseli National Park**. This Park is situated at the foothills of the **Majestic Mount Kilimanjaro** – the highest mountain in Africa. Lunch and afternoon game drive. Gaze upon the swamps where hippos and elephants feed and see large herds of elephants move to and fro in the center of the Park.

DAY 4 Sunday, July 20 Amboseli National Park

Bush BBQ Breakfast on Observation Hill. Depart for morning and afternoon game drives against the backdrop of Mt. Kilimanjaro. The park offers a wide variety of wildlife, but the principal attraction is its vast herds of elephant within the park. The bull elephants here have some of the largest tusks in Kenya. Other game include: zebra, wildebeest, giraffe, impala, leopard, caracal and serval cat. The park boasts a rich bird life such as ibis, egret, avocet, common and saddle-billed stork, secretary bird, heron, vultures, ducks, and geese.

In the shadows of Mt Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest mountain, beside a copse of giant Acacia trees and a gently flowing natural spring, stands Amboseli Serena Lodge. Secluded within a grove of acacia trees, the lodge looks out over the golden savannah plains, with uninterrupted views of the mountain itself. Close by are a series of emerald green swamps, which are fed by the melting snows of Kilimanjaro. These, the only sources of water in this otherwise starkly beautiful but arid park, attract huge numbers of wallowing elephants, hippos, buffalos and plains game. Each of 92 rooms are ensuite with ceiling fans, WFI connectivity, hair dryers and safes. At the center of 'Masailand', the lodge's décor reflects the brilliant primary colors and iconic shapes representative of these legendary warriors. At the heart of the lodge, shaded by palm trees, is a free-form swimming pool; to either side of which stretch the rooms. Each room is housed in a single floor building opening directly on to the grounds, each reflecting a Masai manyatta theme: each with its own hand-painted wall frescos. The central dining area is reached by a timbered bridge over a melt-water stream, while the lounge and bar feature a broad terrace and a blazing fire-pit where evening cocktails can be enjoyed.

DAY 5 Monday, July 21 Drive to Ngorongoro Conservation Area, Tanzania 353km, Drive 6 Hours

After breakfast, transfer to Namanga border and clear customs and immigration facilities. Drive through the Ngorongoro Highlands to your lodge situated on the rim of the crater. The crater covers over 102 square miles of land and is the home of the rare black rhino, prides of lion, elephant, cheetah and great herds of buffalo, antelope and wildebeest. Return to lodge for lunch. Spend a leisurely afternoon. **Sundowner (Happy Hour at Sunset) with Crater View.**

Accommodation: Ngorongoro Serena Lodge

Meals: Lunch, Dinner & Breakfast



DAY 6 Tuesday, July 22 Drive to Serengeti National Park, Tanzania 145km, Drive 3 Hours

Depart after breakfast and drive to the crater rim of the Serengeti National Park. You will descend 600m (Over 2,000 feet) to the floor of the crater for a half day crater tour with picnic lunch boxes. Explore the forest areas that are inhabited by monkeys and elephants; the lake area, where you may see the flamingos and the open savannah where the lions hunt for food. Drive to Serengeti National Park. Enjoy a game drive in route to the camp.

DAY 7 Wednesday, July 23 Full Day in Serengeti National Park

Breakfast in the Bush with Breathtaking View of the Serengeti. Full day game drive in Serengeti National Park. The vast grasslands of this renowned Park provide what many consider to be the quintessential African game viewing experience. Meaning 'endless plains' in the language of the Masai, this land of immense open spaces is home to literally millions of large herbivores, as well as the accompanying carnivores. The Serengeti is renowned for having the largest concentration of migratory animals in the world, and is also famous for its large lion population. The Serengeti National Park forms part of a huge conservation area, encompassing the adjacent Ngorongoro Conservation Area, as well as the Masai Mara National Reserve in Kenya.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner



Set high on the saddle of a tree-clad ridge, commanding panoramic views across the Serengeti, the Serengeti Serena Lodge is the ultimate fusion of traditional African architecture and world-class style. Winner of numerous awards from the world travel press, it is perhaps the finest venue the Serengeti has to offer. Centrally located adjacent to the famous Western Corridor and Grumeti River, the lodge has been designed to blend completely into the living landscape. A series of traditional domed 'rondavels' are widely spaced throughout the grounds, which are cooled by groves of acacia trees and watered by sparkling streams. On the very edge of the ridge is a 'vanishing horizon' pool, which looks out over the 'endless plains' after which the Serengeti is named. Situated close to the world-famous 2-million-year-old paleolithic site of Ol Duvai, 'birthplace of mankind', the lodge has been styled to offer a showcase of cultural performance, heritage and traditional art, which is best illustrated by the lavish Makonde carvings which decorate both the rooms and

the stunning domed dining room. As for wildlife, the Serengeti National Park offers not only all the members of 'The Big Five' (elephant, rhino, lion, leopard and buffalo), but also the annual 'migration' of over one million wildebeest and their attendant cast of predators. Accommodation is in 66 luxurious ensuite rooms housed in rondavels. Other facilities include a restaurant, bar, swimming pool, gift shop and evening entertainment.

DAY 8 Thursday, July 24 Fly to Masai Mara Game Reserve, Kenya

After breakfast, drive to Seronera airstrip for your morning flight to Masai Mara. Upon arrival, you will be met at the airstrip by the camp driver/guide. The Masai Mara is the northernmost extension of the Serengeti and a gem in itself. The camp operates throughout the year, the migration of wildebeest covers July through October, quickly followed by the birthing season from October to March. Lunch at the camp and thereafter enjoy your first game viewing drive. Return to the camp at sunset.

DAY 9 Friday, July 25 Full Day in Masai Mara Game Reserve

Early morning and afternoon game drives in the Masai Mara National Reserve, Kenya's best and most scenic game park. At the northern extremity of the unique Serengeti ecosystem, blessed with a permanent water supply, the Masai Mara has a thriving, permanent population of plains game, augmented in the dry season by the migration of two million gnus and zebras from the vast, parched Serengeti plains. Of the hunter's "big five," elephant, buffalo, lion, and leopard are quite common, while even the much rarer rhino might come out of the thicket for you. Hyenas are plentiful and the cheetah, a 60-mile-per-hour daytime hunter, is often seen. Besides being the setting for the ancient and often tragic spectacle of the Great Migration, other marvels of the Masai Mara include giraffe, elephant, red-tailed monkeys and a host of antelope. Twice-daily interpretive game drives led by our highly trained and experienced rangers, bird watching with resident guides and naturalists reveal the wonders of the Mara. Masai Mara is also the home of the Masai people, known for their distinctive customs and dress – red robes, elaborate beadwork, spears and bells. On a visit to the Masai village, you can meet the families, visit a typical home, learn about daily life, enjoy singing and dancing and visit their own handicrafts market. ***Lamp-Lit Bush Dinner Served by the Mara River, with Campfire and Masai Dance Performance.***

Secreted deep within the Masai Mara National Reserve, the Mara Serena Safari Lodge is the ultimate safari destination. Set high on a bush-cloaked hill, embraced by arcing vistas and washed by a sea of richly rolling grasslands, it stands centre-stage to one of Africa's most dramatic wildlife arenas and has a ringside seat for the greatest wildlife show on earth, the legendary migration of the wildebeest. No other lodge in the Masai Mara has such spectacular 360° views of the surrounding landscape. You can sit at the gorgeous swimming pool and look down towards the Mara River where thousands of wildebeest gather in July or August, in readiness to cross on their annual migration. They may wait there for days before deciding to take the plunge. Drawing its inspiration from the traditional Masai cultural motif of a cluster of domed, mud-colored huts encircled by a "Boma" of brushwood, the Mara Serena offers a rare blend of raw African splendor and sumptuous sophistication. The essentially ethnic décor also draws on a vibrant color-palette of sun-burst

colors, embellished by a unique selection of Masai art to create the look and feel of a traditional bush encampment. The lodge features a sky-blue swimming pool and a spectacular restaurant, overlooking a water hole where a variety of wildlife come to drink. 74 guest rooms, styled to mirror the circular motif of a traditional Masai "Manyatta", the lodge has been designed to blend international sophistication with raw African beauty. The wide-spaced and secluded rooms have been sensitively designed so as to blend seamlessly into the landscape whilst offering magnificent Mara-vistas from their private verandas. As for the interiors, individually styled in exuberant bush colors they feature spacious bathrooms and the calm sophistication of a world-class hotel.

DAY 10 Saturday, July 26 Fly Back to Nairobi, Kenya

After breakfast, transfer to the airstrip for your scheduled flight to Nairobi. Upon arrival, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. ***Farewell dinner at Carnivore Restaurant.*** The amazingly, unique Carnivore Nairobi Restaurant offers the ultimate 'Beast Of A Feast,' a variety of meats including lamb, pork, ostrich, beef camel, spareribs, sausages, chicken, skewered kidneys, and crocodile roasted on traditional Masai swords over a huge charcoal pit.

DAY 11 Sunday, July 27 Depart Nairobi, Kenya

Breakfast at your hotel. Transfer to JKI Airport for your home bound flight.
